“Choices: Through the Eyes of the Students” A Unique Opportunity for Your School to Host a Powerful Exhibit!



“Choices” is an exhibit for and about students; it is completely operated by the students at the school. Students are docents for the week-long exhibit. They are responsible for publicity, they plan appropriate events, and they create their own artwork and programs to accompany the exhibit.

Choices is a 21-panel bilingual exhibit that addresses the choices/moral decisions young people made during the Holocaust and the choices they make today when confronted with stereotyping, prejudice and all violations of human rights. What leads a person to be a bystander or a rescuer when another person’s human rights are violated?

The exhibit promotes peer-based activities, challenging youth to explore issues of intolerance in schools, communities, nationally and globally. Through the use of the Choices Teacher’s Manual, educators, with assistance from NMHRP staff, can guide their students to be docents. Students will learn how to engage their audience in discussion and debate on the choices they make when challenged with issues of discrimination.
